## Membership

We are the only chapter in the State of Idaho, chartered in 1980, and are part of a national organization. Membership to the organization is open to those who are seeking a meaningful volunteer experience with an emphasis on assisting the youth of Ada County. There are various classifications of membership to meet an individual's needs.

## Examples of Community Service

**Main Philanthropies: Operation School Bell, Operation School Supplies, Baby Bundles, Cinderella's Closet, History in the Bown House, and Project Hearing.** Through **Operation School Bell** this past fall we dressed more than 3,700 school children with new clothing, including shirts, jeans, underwear and socks, a sweatshirt, coat and shoes plus a book and a Hygiene Kit. School supplies were provided for 6,800 children, and layettes were distributed to 370 infants and their families. Prom gowns and tuxedos were loaned to 320 teens, and more than 2,000 fourth-graders were given tours of the historical Bown House. Nine scholarships were granted to hearing impaired students and hearing devices were provided for 18 Ada County citizens. All of this was accomplished by volunteers with no paid staff.

This is a 52-acre sports park that includes 17 football/soccer fields, 2 large parking lots, 2 ponds, 2 covered patios, a tennis court, and a Concession Stand with restrooms. Phase 1 is complete and Phase 2 is in progress and will include more restrooms, a playground, and another tennis court. We have invested \$3,000,000.00 so far and still counting.

We support the **Beads of Optimism with St. Luke’s Children’s MSTI**, which builds strings of beads representing every medical procedure a child endures. We assist with a **Summer Picnic** and **A Visit With Santa Christmas Party** for the families.

We support the **Idaho Youth Ranch & Hays Shelter Home** each Christmas. We have many other community projects throughout the year, some of which are **Operation Bear Care, Program Sales for BSU Football and Basketball, and The Humanitarian Bowl Programs**. We encourage our members to bring new projects to our club.

Attending weekly meetings and participation in fundraising and club projects are required for membership.
