### John William Jackson Fund

The John William Jackson Fund is a non-profit organization dedicated to the advancement of academic scholarship, performing arts, and outdoor sporting for Idaho youth. Established in 2000 and staffed entirely by volunteers, the Fund has granted over \$123,000 to Idaho organizations and youth.

In 2007, the John William Jackson Fund created the Idaho Youth Education Recycling Partnership. The essence of the partnership is to collect scrap metals from businesses, construction projects, etc., and recycle those materials to further fund youth grants. Pacific Steel and Recycling is their largest supporter.

The Idaho Youth Education Recycling Partnership includes over 60 local organizations and has generated over \$19,000 over the past two years from recycling alone. In 2008, nearly 190,000 pounds of metals (i.e. scrap iron, aluminum, aluminum cans, brass, copper, stainless steel, and lead) were recycled. The Partnership also facilitates the recycling of cardboard and plastic.
