



**METAL DETECTING:** Metal detecting is permitted in City of Boise parks and facilities with the procurement of a Boise Parks and Recreation Department Metal Detecting Permit. A metal detector is defined as an electronic instrument which detects the presence of metal objects nearby. Metal detectors can be useful for finding metal objects hidden within other objects or buried underground. Metal detectors often consist of a handheld unit, with a sensor probe that can be swept over the group. **The purpose of this application is for the customer to voluntarily adhere to city policies while using a Metal Detecting Permit.**

**RESTRICTED AREAS:** Metal detecting is permitted in all City of Boise parks and facilities **except** at Warm Springs Golf Course, Quail Hollow Golf Course, Morris Hill Cemetery, Pioneer Cemetery, Fort Boise Military Reserve Cemetery and Zoo Boise.

**METAL DETECTING PERMIT POLICIES:** The permit holder acknowledges that this application serves as a request for a Metal Detecting Permit. Permits must be renewed the third fiscal year from the date purchased. **This application serves for the 2021 Fiscal Year and will expire September 30, 2023.**

1. Metal Detecting Permit must be worn in plain sight when permit holder is metal detecting on Boise City properties.
2. The Metal Detecting Permit cannot be loaned or borrowed - it is registered in the permit holder's name and is only authorized to be used by such registered individual.
3. Permits may be issued to users under the age of 18 with a guardian's signature.
4. No knife or trowel can be used to cut plugs or remove grass. Grass removal is strictly prohibited.
5. Always heal probed ground.
6. Divots are not allowed.
7. Probes longer than eight inches, or wider than 1/4 inch are not allowed.
8. Use good judgement while metal detecting to create a minimal disturbance in the area.
9. The City of Boise is not liable for any personal injury or lost articles.
10. Permit holder must adhere to Boise City Code Title 7, Chapter 7: Public Parks.

## GENERAL PARK USE POLICIES

### CANOPY, TENT OR KIOSK

Placement requires approval from BPR prior to event. All canopies will be weighted instead of staked to avoid damage to electrical, irrigation and water lines. Contact Boise Fire Department, Fire Code Enforcement at (208) 570-6572 to obtain a permit for tents, canopies, and awnings over 200 square ft. per structure. U.F.C. Article 32, B.F.D. Tent Permit.

### CLEANLINESS

Cleanliness is the responsibility of all park users. Deposit trash in the receptacles provided. If trash receptacles are full, trash is to be removed from the park by the user.

- Cooking grease must be caught and properly disposed.
- Dispose of used briquettes in fire rings or fireplaces.
- Confetti, bird seed, popcorn, rice, etc. is prohibited. Bubbles are acceptable.
- Decorations may be attached only by tying to metal, wooden, or stone structures or must be self-supporting. All decorations must be removed at the end of the event.

### DOGS

Unless otherwise posted or stated in Boise City Code, pets are permitted in most parks, but must be on a leash. Pet owners are required to clean up after their pets. Pets should not harass, stalk or chase waterfowl, other animals or humans.

### ELECTRICAL POWER

Electrical power is available with a reservation at all reserved sites except C.W. Moore Park, Esther Simplot Friendship Island and Pier, Julia Davis Rose Garden, Kathryn Albertson Park and Marianne Williams Gazebo. Please use only one appliance per outlet.

### GLASS CONTAINERS

Glass beverage containers are prohibited.

### PARK HOURS

Parks are open from sunrise to sunset unless otherwise posted.

### PARKING

Parking is limited to designated areas and is available on a first-come, first-served basis. Vehicles parked in NO PARKING areas or left in the park after sunset will be towed at owners' risk and expense. Contact: Boise Valley Towing (208) 389-9707.

### SALES

A license from the city of Boise and a permit from the BPR are required to sell or rent products or services in Boise City parks.

### SMOKING

Per Boise City Code, smoking is not permitted except in designated smoking areas in Ann Morrison and Julia Davis Parks, and at Quail Hollow and Warm Springs Golf Courses.

### SOUND AMPLIFICATION

Sound must not exceed 62 decibels at 20 ft. except as authorized by written permit.

### SPEED

The speed limit within parks is 15 mph, unless otherwise posted.

### TREES

Damaging trees on park property is not permitted. This includes attaching signs or related hardware (ropes, wires, nails, etc.) to any tree. It is also not permitted to tie/lock animals or bicycles to trees.
