1. PICK A LOCATION

If you want to close your street, apply for a Citizen Use Permit from the Ada County Highway District (the application fee is generally waived for neighborhood groups).

If you want to use a public park, review the General Park Use Policy

2. LET YOUR NEIGHBORS KNOW

Make a flyer (or use ours) to let your neighbors know when and where the party will be

Encourage people to maintain physical distancing guidelines (6 ft between people) by bringing their own food and beverages to the party, along with a lawn chair or picnic blanket to sit on

Encourage people to wear masks to prevent the spread of Covid-19 and keep others safe

3. PLAN A FEW ACTIVITIES
