// MESSAGE FROM THE CHIEF

The Boise Police Department is charged with keeping our vibrant, diverse, and engaged community safe. As the Interim Chief, I am honored to be given this opportunity and grateful for the many years I've been able to serve and work with the people of Boise.

This report highlights trends in our city and the work done by our officers and professional staff over the last year. In 2022, Boise's crime rate continued to go down, with the biggest decrease in burglaries and thefts. We also saw a significant decrease in traffic crashes, and we remain strongly committed to working with our partners to improve traffic safety. In 2022 we did see an increase in the number of calls for service where mental health may be a factor, so after doubling our Behavioral Health Response Team, we have been exploring new ways to expand the team and guide future investments in this area. As a department, we are taking care of our officers and staff with thoughtfully researched training and wellness programs, so they can in turn take better care of our community. In 2023, we continue our focus on Community Policing and evolving our response models to proactively meet the community's needs. We are also excited to partner with the Boise Police Activities League to offer new ways for officers to engage with residents as we strive to create a city for everyone.

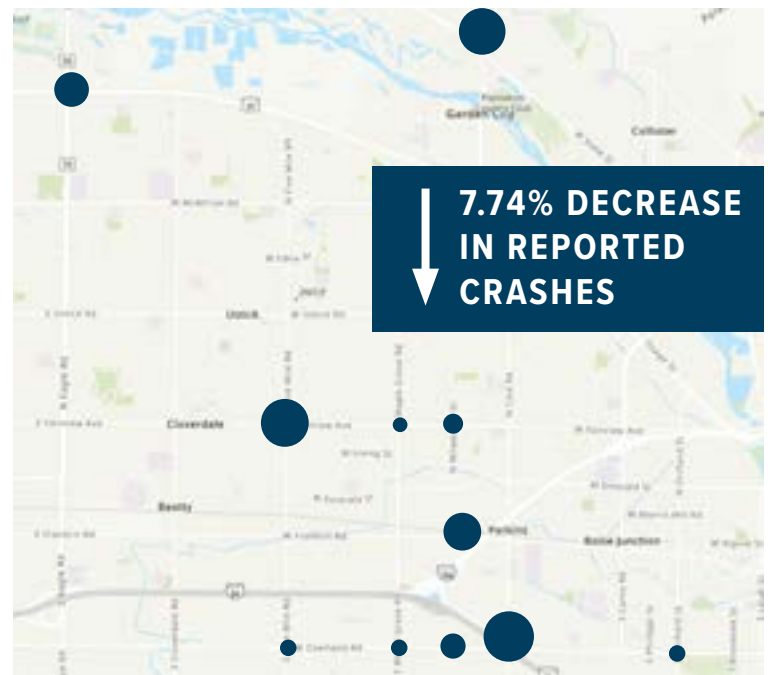

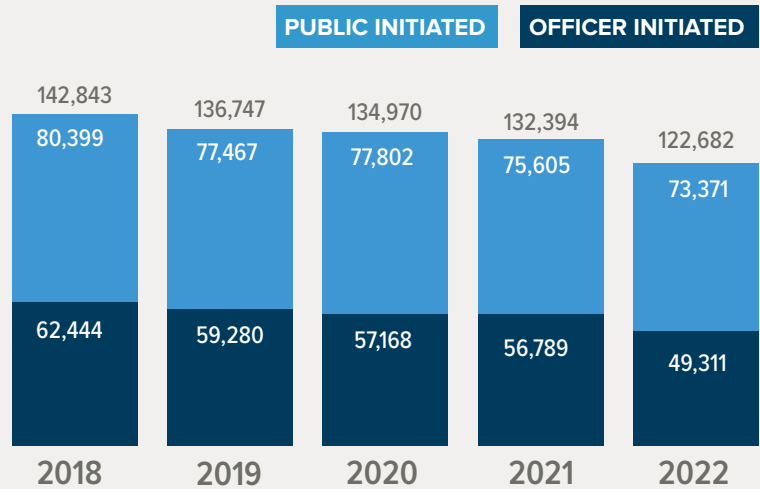

OFFICER TRAINING

Officers receive training on Crisis Intervention, De-escalation, Human and Civil Rights and Implicit Bias.



BODY-WORN CAMERAS

All uniformed officers wear body-cameras. Officers record all investigative enforcement contacts, prisoner transports, persons complaining of officer conduct, or when a contact is anticipated to be confrontational in nature, unless an articulated reason justifies otherwise. Video is reviewed on all complaints and use of force reports.

Entry Level (PO)	\$30.58	Laterals received half-time credit for years of service up to 14 years. For example, incoming lateral officers with 10 years of experience would be a PO-5.
1st year (PO-1)	\$33.27	
3rd year (PO-3)	\$38.71	
5th year (PO-5)	\$44.13	
7th year (PO-7)	\$46.47
