

Rose Bed Layout


1 Roses Along ADA Gravel Path



- Secondary walkways through garden
- ADA accessible
- ② Roses Along Grass



- Act as tertiary pathways through garden that are less traveled
- Minimum width allows for proper irrigation of grass without effecting roses



③ Concrete Path

 Restoring the ADA accessibility with concrete walkways

4 ADA Gravel Path



- Secondary walkways through garden.
- ADA accessible
- Durable against heavy traffic
- Rustic aesthetic compliments the garden
- Suitable for all weather conditions

5 Event Space

- Formal lawn area to host events such as weddings
- Adjacent lawn areas to allow for expansion of event space as needed






- Interactive garden area for children to learn and play with a selection of plants that a variety of sensory traits that appeal to touch, sight and smell
