

STAGED REOPENING OF

CITY FACILITIES AND SERVICES

The Mayor will decide when the City of Boise will change stages (forward or backward) based on data and science, including information about the spread of the virus, healthcare capacity, and our public health system's ability to test and isolate rapidly. The facility and service openings outlined here are tentative and could change.

City of Boise outdoor pools will not open for the Summer 2020 season.

Book drops open and curbside pick-up and drop-off begins at all locations The Main Library offers appointments for computer access Reservations for park shelters or picnic sites are open for gatherings that adhere to group size limits Dog parks reopen in full Quail Hollow Golf Course opens with single rider cart rentals available Warm Springs Golf Course (opened in Stage 1) offers single rider cart rentals Military Reserve Bike Park dirt trails reopen (weather permitting) Trailhead restrooms and restrooms at identified parks reopen Tennis and pickleball courts reopen Maintenance and restoration services mostly operating at full-service levels Additional City of Boise staff increases across city departments 	 Library expands curbside pick-up; increased access to technology by appointment Business licenses are open to apply for at this time, online or appointment only where fingerprints are needed.
